We've now managed to stabilise the feeding money so that there is definitely a cooked meal every day of the year for every child, and we'll investigate how best to use the tiny wee bit of spare money. Sophie and I think that the best use is towards enhancing the schooling infrastructure, to improve the quality of education they receive, and we'll also investigate how they are funded for consumables like pencils and paper. Last time we bought 18 plastic seats so that every child had a seat. It's oh so difficult to find out what is really needed at such a distance, and when we're face-to-face it may well work better. We'll also be looking at their new vegetable gardens to see if there's any way we could help to encourage their move to cash crop from merely subsistence farming.

Needless to say we'll keep you informed on our return.

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
